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**Norman Way Bridge Replacement**

ERIE, PA (March 28, 2013) The City of Erie wishes to advise motorists that the replacement of the Norman Way bridge is scheduled to begin on or about April 2, 2013. The bridge, located just east of the intersection with SR 0505 (Glenwood Park Avenue), carries traffic over Mill Creek.

The replacement of the structurally deficient bridge, built in 1954, will cost approximately \$1 million. The federal government is paying 80 percent of the project cost; the state, 15 percent; and the city, 5 percent. The contractor for the project is Shingledecker's Welding, Inc. of Franklin, PA. The work is expected to be complete by the end of the 2013 construction season.

The bridge will be closed for the duration of the project. A posted detour will be established utilizing SR 4016 (West 38<sup>th</sup> Street) and Eliot Road. For a majority of the project, two-way traffic will be maintained along SR 0505 (Glenwood Park Avenue). Specific construction operations will require short-term closures of SR 0505 (Glenwood Park Avenue) via the establishment of a posted detour utilizing SR 0019 (Peach Street).

Motorists are asked to drive with extra caution through this area while adjusting to the new traffic control conditions.

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
